Cruising the Great Wilderness Road around Lakes and Mountains

Lakes and mountains make for a dramatic backdrop on this easy going, touring trip plan. There are no tight twisties, but there are some incredible scenic roads over mountains, around lakes, and through some of the most historic sites in Tennessee. Daniel Boone explored here; the Cherokee and Iroquis hunted game, and the TVA flooded portions of the deep valleys to create three of the most popular lakes in the 9 Lakes Region.

DAY 1 Check In to a cabin or RV site at one of the lakefront marinas such as Beach Island Resort Marina or Norris Landing Marina. Cabin rentals are available year-round with lakeside views. Guests enjoy amazing, waterside sunsets and sunrises from their back porches. Take a short ride to Cumberland Gap and stop for a walk around downtown. Sip a coffee from Gap Creek Coffee while sitting alongside the creek. Choose between a scenic drive along US58 to Wilderness Road State Park at Martin's Station or drive east along the SR63 to 25 West. Visit the Hatfield Knob Elk Viewing Tower at the Sundquist WMA. Head back and stop at Shelly Belle's on the River for dinner. Choose a picnic table along the river or take your meal to go. Enjoy a restful night's sleep.





DAY 2 **BLAZE A TRAIL - East Tennessee Crossing Byway**

Today, you will be riding along the route that Daniel Boone walked to open the west. Portions of the route are also part of the **Great Indian Warpath** and have significant **Civil War sites**. Begin on 25E and travel eighty three miles between **Cumberland Gap National Historic Park** and Hot Springs, NC which will take you along mountain ridges, lake shorelines, rolling farmlands, and along one of the oldest rivers in the US. The trail has a must stop overlook on the **Clinch Mountain Overlook**. Loop back on 25E to Newport to Rutledge on SR92. Stop for a late lunch at the Down Home restaurant. Continue on 11W to Blaine and





DAY 3 Take a short ride to **Norris Dam State Park** to the dam. Head out on SR33 south to 170. Head west until Hickory Valley intersects with 61. Bear left. You will pass by **Big Ridge State Park**. Continue until you hit the intersection of Norris Freeway. Turn left into the **Town of Norris**. Follow Norris Rd which will take your through town. Stay on Norris Rd until it intersects with 441. Turn right and continue to the **dam overlook.** Plan on eating lunch at **Clinch River Brewing**. The backyard patio area features a trout pond, seating, and a fire pit. Nearby is the **Museum of Appalachia** if you prefer an alternate stop for lunch.
